HIGHWAY REPORT

Dale Sellen

In March the men have spread 174 ton of salt and sand mix on our State roads and 189 ton of mix on the Town and County roads. The men have been repairing and painting the plow equipment. Some of the shop work that would have normally been done through the winter months is being done now that the snow has let up. Jeff has the wood chipper primed and is ready for color. Eric has been stripping the plow equipment from the grader, Mark has his plow and wing painted and has been hauling crusher run from Seneca Stone.

Frank and I have received quotes for the cold storage building. This should give us an idea on what to expect for costs. We will have to pay prevailing state wage, which will escalate the cost enough to have to advertise and put the package out for bids.

Frank met with Fisher Associates on the bridge replacement proposal that was submitted for Federal and State funding. If the Town Board decides to take advantage of this, we will have to propose a referendum stating that we would like to proceed to the next phase and accept the money. As the project progresses, more information will follow.

The men have been patching, replacing culverts, ditching and brooming.

Frank and Dale talked about the replacement of the bridge on Creek Road. The cost would be about \$590,000 and the Town would be responsible for about 5% of the cost.

ASSESSOR'S UPDATE

Lorie Fessenden

2011 assessment and equalization:

The 2011 equalization rate will remain at 100%. I have submitted the required for that process. The state will not be offering state aid for 2011 reassessments unless the municipality has not requested state aid in the last 3 years.

I would like to point out that the Town of Genoa is trended with the other towns in Southern Cayuga County by NYS ORPS. So, sales in all towns located in the southern Cayuga County area are used for the calculation of Equalization rates. ORPS uses sales from 7/2/2009-7/1/20010.

Based on all those sales, a negative trend of 2% was established for residential properties waterfront and non-waterfront. I reviewed our sales and saw that many of the sales prices are actually higher than assessed value.

I have been working on new construction values and reviewing any parcels residents have requested me to look at.

Exemptions

I have completed the exemption process and will be sending letters to notify property owners if their exemption(s) will be removed this year. Many property owners did not return requested documentation with their renewal. I returned most with another request for the documentation. The few that came in right on March 1st I did not. When these come in at the last possible moment it leaves no time for me to give a return request. Many people just simply did not return a renewal at all. I sent reminders to them.

Stuart talked about Pine Hollow Road and the increase in traffic. With some hidden driveways, it is becoming dangerous. He suggested reinstalling the 4-way stop signs at the top of the hill. He suggested lines be painted on the road. Dale will talk to the Cayuga County Highway Department about this.

The Board decided to attend the meeting suggested by Mr. Peters and Mr. Corcoran. Lorie will call to accept the invitation.
