REPORTS

HIGHWAY REPORT

Brandon White

In March the men have applied 65 ton of salt and cinder mix to our County roads and 35 tons of mix to our Town roads. Eric has been up east with the grader pushing the banks back, while Matt was on the west side doing the same with the ditcher and blade.

With the snowy weather letting up, Mark has been patching some of the worst holes, Jeff has been hauling Item 4 from Seneca Stone and Matt and Eric have been ditching and installing driveway culverts on Powers Road.

Cayuga County is still trying to delegate their roadside mowing to the Towns. Most of the Towns are not favoring it because of the price they want to pay per mile. They started with the Superintendents, then went to the Supervisors trying to sell their idea.

The raise for the 2015 CHIPS money was shot down, but we will receive an increase in the Winter Recovery portion. The Town's total now stands at \$118,699.56

Heavy trucks hauling from Blakely Road and running south on Sill Road have done some severe damage to the road. It's a shame they couldn't have waited till the frost had finished coming out. Now the taxpayers in this Town will have to pay for the benefit another County will receive from the material.

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WATER REPORT

Mark Conner 2,663,700 - March total 85,900 - Average

Mark is still looking for leaks as he drives the roads. He feels some of the leaks are within residents' homes and he feels that they are somewhere west of Bartnick Road.

Mark has looked into the auto-dialer system and received a quote of \$1950 from Pleasant Valley. An additional charge, per month, of no more than \$50 will be incurred by the cell phone used with the auto dialer.

There are still problems at the pump house. Pleasant Valley was called in to troubleshoot. Rewiring was done until a new level control float switch comes in. Mark mentioned that a major overhaul is needed for the wiring in the pump house.

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OLD BUSINESS

The Town of Genoa Annual Report has been filed.

NEW BUSINESS

A letter was received from the County with regard to a parcel of land for sale. It borders property owned by the Town south of Route 90 behind the gravel pit.

Lorie received a letter from Pickard & Anderson with regard to the monitoring of the Town landfill. They will be taking samples in August. This is the fifth year of the 4th five year sampling.

Lorie discussed a letter she received regarding IMAP (Intrastate Mutual Aid Program). In case of a declared local disaster, participating Towns could be asked for assistance. It is not obligatory and requested assistance can be declined. The Town will be a part of IMAP. It was brought to the attention of the Board that payment for an ad placed in the Citizen with regard to a variance meeting is overdue. It is part of the variance application process that the resident(s) requesting the meeting pay for the meeting advertisement. The bill in question has not been paid and it was decided that no further variances requested by this particular resident(s) will be considered until this bill has been paid. The Supervisor will write a letter to this effect. Lorie received a reply from the County to the proposed law banning hydrofracking in the Town. It was sent to them last month. The reply was that there was no need for involvement of the County. She will speak with the Town attorney about further action and there may be a Public Hearing at the June 10 Board meeting.

Matt Sellen will, once again, mow lawns for the Town. He has increased his price to \$225. The highway employees would like to go to four 10 hour days per week starting in May. The Board suggested they try it for May and June and then revisit it at the July Board meeting. Frank would like the Board to consider purchasing a track hoe to take the place of the dozer which was built in 1965 and isn't in good shape. He also mentioned that the one-ton truck is up for replacement. The sander is okay but the truck would need a new plow.

The Board continued looking over the cell tower contract

With no further business, on a motion of Board member Shields, seconded by Board member White, the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m. Carried unanimously.
